LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



As we continue to navigate the disruptions and challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, I would like to take a moment to express my gratitude for how our community has been responding, and to reflect on what guides our decision-making during this challenging time.

I truly appreciate the hard work and ingenuity shown by our staff in these unprecedented times. They have worked tirelessly to develop and implement ways to support micro-entrepreneurs and help sustain their livelihoods.

In response to the crisis, Seed Out promptly launched a ration distribution campaign, "Socho Sab Kay Liye" to help low-income households cope up with the adverse economic shock that their micro-businesses were undergoing. Generous donations helped us assist 2500 poor families in getting a month's supply of ration. Vulnerable segments including widows, single mothers, and the differently-abled were provided assistance on a priority basis.

This has been an extremely challenging year for micro-entrepreneurs as they saw their cash flows disrupted and their working capital eaten up. The lockdown disrupted businesses and income-generating opportunities almost completely. Seed Out has stood by its micro-entrepreneurs during these difficult times. Those facing low sales were given generous relaxation in loan recovery and those whose businesses were significantly affected were provided additional financial assistance to help revive them. Seed Out continued with its mission of poverty alleviation unabated. I am happy to share that Seed Out closed this year with a beneficiary base of 1115 and has disbursed PKR 87 million in interest-free loans across its network of 4 branches.

Where do we go from here?

This is the time to adapt to a consequentially changing business trajectory; embracing digitization has become a necessity in what is being called the "new normal". Seed Out carried out a survey which revealed that there was an increased willingness on behalf of micro-entrepreneurs, particularly those in the 18-30 age bracket, to explore the prospects of digitizing their business activities. To help micro-entrepreneurs meet these challenges, Seed Out has partnered with Solutions Ahead to impart training in the skills of today i.e. digital marketing, digital finance, online market linkages. After our success in Bahawalnagar, Seed Out will open its doors to the people of Sialkot in the coming year. Our voyage is not over yet and we need you by our side to sail this ship further. Seed Out promises to reinforce your trust in us by working harder to give freedom to those stuck in poverty's vicious cycle.

WHAT WE DO?

i. 100% Interest free in-kind loans

Seed Out aims to create sustainable businesses for its beneficiaries and has adopted an approach that is consistent with this objective. Seed Out's fund is utilized to help beneficiaries with asset based projects. An in kind loan, in the form of inventory and tangible assets that are required for starting or expanding a business, is provided to the beneficiaries, in accordance with their needs and requirements. We have eliminated cash transfer during the process, ensuring that the donated amount is solely utilized for the intended purpose of income generation.

The average loan size disbursed is a sizeable amount of PKR 70,000 which ensures that borrowers are made self-sufficient and do not feel the need to return for additional borrowing. If borrowers do return, it is usually in the case of business scale up. Our loan size ranges from PKR 30,000 to PKR 200,000. Seed Out provides 100% waiver in case of death or any unforeseen circumstance.

ii. Capacity Building

Seed Out wants its entrepreneurs to succeed and hence invests significantly in building the capacity of each and every entrepreneur so they can better use the capital that they access and impact is maximized. Training, skills development and capacity building workshops are regularly conducted so that the entrepreneurs can successfully execute their respective businesses. These workshops also allow the entrepreneurs to network with others.



WHAT WE DO?

iii. Social Interventions

Seed Out believes in holistic human development and strives to achieve more than poverty alleviation alone.

Seed Out's social interventions aim to create awareness about social issues and gender discrimination at the community level. Synergizing economic empowerment with greater social and legal empowerment, we hope to enable women have greater autonomy over their lives.

Our community sessions create awareness on health, hygiene & nutrition, education, gender discrimination and women empowerment.



As a condition for loan eligibility, all micro-entrepreneurs are required to send their children to school. Seed Out also provides all of its borrowers with health cards which they and their family members can avail to receive free-of-cost medical treatment. Seed Out has also introduced a round-the-clock telehealth facility, which allows beneficiaries to connect with a medical professional to seek prompt advice conveniently. Women particularly benefit from the convenience and are much more likely to seek medical advice due to the reduced cost.



HIGHLIGHTS OF 2020

UPLIFTING MARGINALIZED COMMUNITIES WITH THE PUNJAB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND

In December 2019, Seed Out and **Punjab Skills Development Fund (PSDF)** came together to empower vulnerable communities most susceptible to social and economic exclusion. Transgender, religious minorities and the differently-abled, who have been trained in vocational skills by PSDF, the largest skills development fund in Pakistan, will be provided financial assistance by Seed Out to start their own businesses and determine their life path!

In February 2020, Seed Out helped **5 transgender individuals** who had been trained in beautician skills by the **International Fashion Academy of Pakistan**, to set up their own beauty salons in Lahore. Our beneficiaries have also become a powerful voice in their community, leading by example and encouraging others to demonstrate resilience in the face of persecution and carving out a identity determined by oneself.









CORONA RELIEF SUPPORT

The spread of COVID-19 and the lockdown in Pakistan created unemployment for the daily wage workers. Individuals who work in the informal economy saw their businesses completely shut down and were left with no choice but to remain confined to their homes. As a result of losing livelihoods, millions faced the threat of food shortage and malnutrition.







Seed Out wishes to stand with disadvantaged communities at every step of their struggle. To combat the crippling effects of COVID-19, Seed out attempted to create a meaningful social impact through the distribution of ration. Seed Out launched a ration distribution campaign, "Socho Sab Kay Liay", in which it distributed a month's supply of ration to 2500 poor families across 4 cities of Punjab: Lahore, Gujranwala, Faisalabad and Bahawalnagar. Vulnerable individuals, including women who are widowed or divorced, were provided assistance on a priority basis.

LAHORE

Humaira Khalid is an epitome of strength and perseverance. She was referred to Seed Out by Smile Again Foundation after she underwent surgery to recover from the burns that she faced. Unfortunately, Humaira faced persecution upon changing her religion to Islam but despite the injustice she faced, she has emerged as strong as ever. She is supporting her husband in looking after their 5 children. She has 2 sons and three daughters. All children are school going, the youngest child being in the nursery.

An undeterred woman, Humaira works as a sweeper in Mayo hospital in Lahore. She had to temporarily quit her work because of her condition but was determined to start working again. Her husband cannot do demanding work and runs a grocery store on a minuscule scale. Their combined income was extremely low and not enough to meet the most basic of needs. However, Humaira wasn't one to give up. She started learning driving and then approached Seed Out to get an auto-rickshaw and start her own pick and drop service.

Humaira is now working again at the hospital. She leaves her house in Sheikhupura for work at 6 pm, picks up her customers, who are doctors who work at the hospital in Lahore, does a night shift at the hospital, and drops her customers back to Sheikhupura. Once home, she looks after her children. Humaira's hard work and strength is indeed unparalleled. She will not let anything or anyone get in the way of her happiness and the wellbeing of her children! Humaira is her children's hope and a role model for women and men alike. By supporting Humaira, Seed Out is proud of supporting the ideals of women empowerment, strength, hard work and perseverance.



MUHAMMAD ASGHAR

BAHAWALNAGAR

Muhammad Asghar wanted to be known for his ability rather than disability. As a young boy, his family was very worried about who will take care of him but his sheer determination and perseverance proved to the world that when God is by a person's side, all things are set straight. Despite being disabled from both my legs, Muhammad Asghar dedicated 20 years of his life to electrician work. He got his shop and with this income, he feeds his 5 children and sends all of them to school. He has 4 daughters and a son.

According to Muhammad Asghar, Seed Out has a big role in his life. According to Asghar, "I got an interest free loan which helped strengthen my business, there has been a substantial increase in my income. Seed Out provides poor people an opportunity to build their lives, and I wish that Seed Out helps many more"

NAGEENA AHMED

LAHORE

Nageena Ahmed is a brave and resilient woman, willing to face all challenges with a strong will. A few years ago, 35-year-old Nageena lost her husband, leaving her alone to take care of her 3 young sons, all of whom attend school. Her husband used to make sure that his wife and children are well taken care of and all their needs are fulfilled. But Nageena and her children lost this protection and sense of security after he suddenly passed away. Although heartbroken at first, she realized that she will have to take on immense responsibility in order to ensure that she provides a good standard of living to her children.

Nageena already had extensive experience in clothing and stitching. After her husband's death, she began to look for ways to expand her business. She hired a person to help her with stitching clothes and started to take her business more and more seriously. Even after years of hard work, Nageena felt like she had a long way to go. This is when she approached Seed Out.

Nageena grew her business with the help of the interest free loan from Seed Out. With her new stock, she has been taking on bigger and fancier orders which help her get a higher margin. Her savings have increased and Nageena is able to provide a much better lifestyle to her 3 young boys. Nageena considers Seed Out's intervention a blessing for her and her children.



RAJA ZIA-UL-HASSAN GUJRANWALA

Raja Zia-ul-Hassan is a shining example of the importance of hard work and enthusiasm to progress further in life. He was born into a very poor family and received education till middle school. Till 45 years of age, he did not earn enough. Then, he decided to start his own business and started selling spices in the wholesale market. This changed his life. He was encouraged by the little profit he made initially and decided to permanently pursue this work. Raja was never shy of hard work and risk. He took a loan from Seed Out which gave a major boost to his business.

He was elated. After a few years, he took a loan to further expand his business and this again had a big impact on his business and lifestyle. He was able to send his only child, 14-year-old Aoun-ul-Hassan, to a good school and look after his wife and old mother.

Raja is a change-maker. He wanted to further progress in life so his son would not have to experience poverty like he did as a child. Raja approached Seed Out for the third time for a loan of R.s. 200,000 to print polythene bags with the brand name "Raja Masala" and invest further in stock, especially cardamom, due its good profitability. Raja's business is indeed a success story!

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE SEED OUT TRUST

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of SEED OUT (the trust), which comprise the statement of financial position as at June 30,2020, and the related income and expenditures account, statement of cash flows, statement of changes in accumulated fund for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of SEED OUT (the trust) as at June 30, 2020 and of its financial performance and its accumulated fund for the year then ended in accordance with approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) as applicable in Pakistan. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.
